

Bayou Tower: Patient Care Begins July 19!

- Monitors that communicate with nurses' phones to alert them to changes in a patient's heart rhythm.
- Built-in blinds in doors and windows to support infection-control efforts.
 New patient-lifting systems in SICU and MICU rooms designed to help associates avoid back problems when moving patients.

These are just some of the exciting innovations that come with the opening of the new Bayou Tower at SHHP. The new addition features 112 private rooms that include bathrooms with showers in every room, as well as pull-out sofas and chairs for a family member to stay overnight with the patient.

Associates and the public got a sneak peek at some of the floors in the new Bayou Tower June 26 - 28, and plans are to begin caring for patients in the

More Details About Moving Into Bayou Tower

A multi-disciplinary team of Sacred Heart associates has spent several months working out a detailed plan for moving patients from the existing hospital into the new Bayou Tower on July 19.

The transition has been carefully planned to ensure patient safety and comfort. A Command Center will be activated at 5 a.m. on Move Day to provide overall direction and to provide a "one-stop" location to report all issues arising during the move. Six transport teams will move two patients at a time. Units will move patients in coordination with the Command Center and Patient Receiving Teams in the Bayou Tower. The plan is for each nurse's assigned patients to move in sequence so that nurses can quickly resume care of their patients once the transfer is made.

The new tower has five new floors and 112 private rooms that were added on top of the three-floor Heart & Vascular Institute. Once the move is complete, the hospital will proceed with converting semi-private rooms in the Main Tower/Main Hospital to private rooms.

The planning team is led by **Amy Wilson**, SHHP CNO, and **Mike Matroni**, Emergency Preparedness and Security Manager. The committee included leaders from Nursing, Information Systems, Pharmacy, Facilities, Environmental Services, Food Services, telecommunications, Material Services, Bed Placement, Admission and Registration, Education and Marketing.

Shuttle Service to South Side of SHHP Returns on Monday, July 21

Effective **Monday, July 21**, the associate shuttle will begin service to the south side of the SHHP campus. The south-side pick-up and drop-off location will be the Bayou Tower entrance. The Shuttle will pick up in Lots B, C and D (North Parking Lots) and make a stop at the Women's & Children's entrance, and then proceed on to the Bayou Tower entrance.

We will also be getting a new shuttle bus to replace one of our aging vehicles. Once received, it will be painted with the Sacred Heart logos and then put into service.

Associates are also reminded of the parking change in the Brent Lane Garage that became effective on July 1. The 4th level of the Brent Lane Garage will no longer be authorized for open parking from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays. Parking on the 4th level of the Brent Lane Garage will revert back to pre-construction restrictions. During the hours of 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. (Monday through Friday) parking will be restricted to Visitors, Properties Tenants in the Payne and DePaul Buildings, associates with 20+ years of service who possess a tenured-parking decal, and Mid-Level physician staff. Night (7 p.m. to 7 a.m.) and Weekend parking are authorized on the 4th level of the Brent Lane Garage to all associates.

Reminder: There is no associate, tenant, or vendor/contractor parking in the surface lot between the Payne and DePaul buildings at any time. These parking spaces are reserved for patients going to the physician offices in those buildings.

Sacred Heart Aims for "Baby-Friendly" Designation

Sacred Heart in Pensacola is one of 89 hospitals selected to be part of Best Fed Beginnings. To help promote breastfeeding, the hospital has received a grant of more than \$10,000 to cover all of the education requirements (20 hours) for all RNs who work with mothers and new babies.

This grant is part of the Baby Friendly Hospital Initiative (BFHI), which is designed to help improve maternity care and increase the number of "baby-friendly" hospitals across the United States. An increase in the number of "baby-friendly" hospitals will lead to a likely increase in the success rate of mothers who want to breastfeed. Breastfeeding is so important because it is a highly effective preventive measure mothers can take for the heath of their babies and themselves.

Approximately one year ago, Sacred Heart implemented a policy eliminating the distribution of commercially-sponsored discharge bags with formula samples to new mothers in its maternity unit. Sacred Heart has recently replaced this most common form of formula marketing with its own breastfeeding discharge bags. Sacred Heart is encouraging breastfeeding and eliminating the use of commercial-formula bags.

This is in line with recommendations by the American Academy of Pediatrics that women should breastfeed exclusively for six months because of the numerous health and economic benefits for both babies and mothers. Region A Hospitals, which include Sacred Heart, have increased aggregate exclusive breastfeeding rates from 38 percent to 61 percent. Region A Hospitals have a greater increase in breastfeeding rates that do hospitals in Regions B and C. Region A Hospitals have also seen a decreased aggregate rate of breastfeeding infants receiving formula supplementation — from 58 percent to 34 percent.

Research shows that breastfeeding shields infants from infections, and later, higher risks of obesity, asthma, diabetes and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS). Mothers benefit from a reduced risk of Type 2 diabetes, breast cancer, obesity, ovarian cancer, post-partum depression and bladder infections.

The recommendation against formula-bag distribution also is supported by Public Citizen, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the World Health Organization, as well as the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Sacred Heart will be the only BFHI-designated hospital in the Northwest Florida/South Alabama area.

Important Notice for Associates Hired Before Jan. 1, 2014

Shannon Higgins, SHHS Human Resource Director, recently shared the following information via e-mail:

- Annual Self-Review Process: Annual Self-Reviews are now ready for your completion in Performance GPS (this is the first step in the process for your annual performance review). Associates will need to complete their self-review no later than July 31, 2014. On Aug. 1, all self-review forms will be sent to the applicable leaders so they can begin their portion of reviewing your performance for the FY14 fiscal year. Keep in mind, if you were hired after January 1st, 2014, you will not be participating in the performance assessment cycle this fiscal year (July 2013 -June 2014).
- Associate Goals: Due to system functionality, associate goals were removed as part of your overall performance assessment and will not be measured during the FY14 review period. However, your leaders will review your contributions to the overall goals for your department when they meet with you to conduct your annual performance review. If you are in a leadership role (have direct reports in the PeopleSoft system), your goals remain in the Performance GPS system and you will be rated accordingly on your goals.
- Education Requirement: Both leaders and associates will be asked to confirm the completion of their annual education during the self-review and performance assessment process. Since the performance assessment is focused on the FY14 fiscal year (July 2013-June 2014), associates and leaders should reference education completion for the same period (September 30, 2013).
- Your Annual Performance Review: Your leader will be scheduling some time to meet with you to conduct your performance review sometime between Aug1. and Oct. 24.
- Access to instructions and training: To ensure that each associate is supported in their efforts to complete this requirement, you will have access to instructions regarding your login and password, step-by-step direc-



tions, and a short tutorial on how to do your self review, as well as a video demonstration of the new look you will see when you access Performance GPS. To access these guides, click on the Performance GPS icon (pictured at left) that is on the SHHS intranet page.








Sacred Heart Cafe Re-Opens With New Look



Only dispose of sharps such as needles, ampules, suture scissors, syringes etc. in the Sharps containers. Drinks, bandages and blood filled IV tubing do not go in the sharps containers.

<u>A Report from Miracle Camp</u> Kids with Arthritis Enjoy a Great Summer Camp Experience

Despite the initial rain, the campers arrived at Kids Arthritis Camp with sunshine in their faces and ready to enjoy all that this year's camp had to offer. This year's superhero-themed camp, located at Sacred Heart's Miracle Camp in Beulah, hosted a group of kids ready to enjoy themselves and have that quintessential summer-camp fun.

Launched in 2006, Kids Arthritis Camp is for children ages 6 to 12 with arthritis and other rheumatic diseases, such as lupus, scleroderma and sarcoidosis. I joined in for the first day of this year's camp and was overwhelmed by – and a bit envious of – all the fun the kids were having. Friday's festivities included outfitting each hero with the appropriate gear – a cape and a mask. Each camper was able to personalize those, as well as team flags. Cat Outzen, Camp Director, says that a successful camp is marked by the joy on each child's face. "A lot of them have struggled with their diagnoses, and it's a good time for them to meet other people like themselves and to be able to talk about their disease without any fear of being made fun of," she says.

Many of the campers are veterans in the program, and return year after year to reunite with old friends and make new ones. "They're not negative, and they're really fun to be around," says camper Gabby Hobbs.

Some of the campers have even returned to offer their help as junior and senior camp counselors. Nick Giovanini, 13, was a camper for two years before taking the opportunity this year to gain some leadership experience as a junior camp counselor.

Kara Dingess returned for her third year as a camp counselor, and relates to the struggles that many of these kids face. "I started out as a camper a few years ago because I have arthritis myself. What keeps me coming back are the kids and the bonds that you make with them. They possess their own strength and they can persevere through whatever they have to go through related to their disease," she says.

I left camp that day sure of two things: each camper was in for one of the best weekends of their summer, and each camper was a superhero to me.
